

# Procedure for the Utilisation of Donor Expressed Breast Milk (DEBM)

### Standard

Donor expressed breast milk will be stored in the designated NICU freezer in an appropriately identified plastic container. Ensure consent has been obtained.

### Principles of care

Prevention of infection Temperature control Promotion of positive parenting

# **Equipment**

Appropriately labelled bottle containing DEBM, syringe(s), Sticky labels, donor Milk Tracking Record, Expressed milk folder.

## **Procedure**

Cleanse hands according to NNU policy

## **Remove DEBM from Freezer**

- 2 Registered Nurses or 1 Registered Nurse and 1 Nursery Nurse must sign out DEBM from the freezer and complete Donor Milk Tracking Record.
- The Donor Milk Tracking Record comes with the DEBM from Glasgow and is stored in Red Folder on top of freezer.
- Cross check batch number of the bottle with number at the top of the page
- Take x1 sticky label from the side of the bottle and place on the donor Milk Tracking Record.
- Complete details:
  - 1. Date Removed from Freezer
  - 2. Baby's Name
  - 3. Location NNU RIE
  - 4. 2 signatures

# • Take DEBM to the Cotside

- Take the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sticky Label from the side of the DEBM and place on Donor Expressed Milk Administration Record. (Keep in baby's own folder) Copy of Admin Record can be found in J Drive under Donor expressed milk folder.
- Complete details:
  - 1. Date
  - 2. Time
  - 3. Expiry Date
  - 4. 2 Signatures
- Unscrew the cap and check that the foil seal is intact

- Discard milk if seal damaged and document in record
- Complete Expressed Breast Milk Label with baby surname and date of birth, date defrosted and time out of freezer. Attach to bottle of DEBM
- Place labelled bottle of DEBM in infant's identified tray in the milk fridge in the nursery to defrost

When all donor milk from each batch has been used - completed Donor Breast Milk Tracking Records should be returned to the Donor Milk Bank (See Red Folder for address)

### Administration of DEBM

- Collect the identified bottle of DEBM from the fridge and take to the infant's cot/incubator
- Cross check the infant's name, date of birth and unit number on the bottle of DEBM with that on the cot /incubator card.
- Ensure that date and time of administration is within 24 hours of removal from freezer.
- If there is no disparity in the 'check' process, withdraw the required volume of milk into syringe
- Attach identification label to syringe or packet
- Place the syringe in the pack in the incubator at the 'top-end' or in tray at the cotside (see note 1)
- Replace the bottle of DEBM in the infant's identified tray in the fridge (see note 2).

### Notes:

- 1. Milk should be taken out of the fridge no longer than one hour prior to administration. Syringes of milk are not to be kept in the trays within the fridge.
- 2. The tray within the fridge should be changed weekly with the infant's identification label and date of changing affixed by the nurse/midwife caring for the infant.

Please Note that DEBM must be checked by 2 Registered Nurses or 1 Registered Nurse and 1 Nursery Nurse when being removed from the freezer and the initial check at the baby's cot side.

# **Potential Complications**

- Frozen DEBM is Defrosted when in transit from Glasgow to the NICU.
- DEBM is incorrectly identified.
- DEBM given to the wrong infant.
- DEBM is discarded from the NICU freezer because the identifier is not recognized as being an NICU patient.

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
