

We hope that this pack will provide all the information you need to refer a patient to our service and that it will be helpful in guiding your decision-making about a patient who you think may require a referral to the RCDS.

## **About Us**

The Rapid Cancer Diagnostic Service (RCDS) is a pathway to allow patients with non-specific cancer symptoms, including 'GP suspicion of cancer' (8% risk) to be referred on to the RCDS pathway and have access to urgent investigation, including CT/MRI scanning, following clinical assessment. The referral to RCDS is supported by the RCDS referral blood bundle which are bloods required prior to acceptance of a referral by a GP or ANP. Patients are supported by a Patient Navigator after referral to improve the patient experience and to coordinate their care.

## **Referral Criteria**


- There is no other urgent site-specific referral pathway suitable for this clinical scenario
- GP and or ANP clinical suspicion of a serious disease that could be due to cancer / GP "gut feeling"
- ≥18 years of age (cancer is very rare under the age of 40 years)
- Unexplained laboratory test findings (e.g. anaemia, thrombocytopenia, hypercalcaemia)
- Unexplained weight loss of >5% (>10% if an isolated symptom)
- Severe unexplained fatigue
- Persistent nausea or appetite loss
- New atypical pain (e.g. diffuse abdominal pain or bone pain).
- The patient is well enough to go through the process
- The patient understands the process and is able to attend the RCDS at short notice.
- Patient should be provided with the enclosed leaflet prior to referral being made to service or you can
  give them the link to the patient facing RCDS website by searching "Fife RCDS patient pathway" or
  following this link.

# **RCDS Blood Bundle**

#### **Mandatory for referral!**

- FBC
- U&E
- LFTs
- Calcium
- Ferritin
- Transferrin saturation
- Coeliac (TTG) antibodies
- TFT
- Glucose and HbA1c
- PSA (men) OR Ca125 (women) - added automatically by the Lab when full RCDS profile is selected



## Who not to refer

- Those patients already on a designated USC pathway
- Those patients who are suitable for another USC pathway
- Referral via all secondary care clinicians including urgent care and GP outside pilot area.
- Patient< 18 years of age.
- Previous cancer diagnosis and symptoms likely due to recurrence (if a known cancer is suspected either primary or secondary/recurrence the patient should be referred directly to the site-specific USC)
- Seen in RCDS within last 3 months with no new symptoms
- Patient too unwell to attend
- Patient requires acute admission to hospital
- Patient unable/unwilling to attend at short notice/for a whole day
- A serious NON-CANCER diagnosis is highly likely (chronic / functional abdominal pain)

## **How to refer**

- This pathway is accessed via SCI Gateway electronic referral system
- Under the Speciality you will choose RCDS → Urgent Suspicion Cancer → Cancer Site Unknown
- RCDS Bundle available in Cyberlabs for the necessary blood bundle required at time of referral and must be completed

# Important information to include in your referral

Please include detailed information relating to the patient and their symptoms and examination. Also include information about any weight loss (weight lost if known, or down dress sizes / belt loops) and the duration of this. Include any history of cancer for the patient/family. Mention whether the GP has made the patient aware they must be available at short notice and please note any sensory/cognitive impairment and whether they are being supported by a relative / spouse who we should be speaking to instead of the patient.

#### What patients should expect

Patients will receive a telephone call to patients within 24-72 hours by our Patient Navigator / Advanced Clinical Nurse Specialist. A triage process (including a review of RCDS bundle and frailty assessment and telephone clinical assessment of patient) will then direct patients straight to investigation if referral is accepted. Results will be fed back promptly to patients as soon as possible. If further tests are required, the RCDS team will organise these and inform the patient directly. The RCDS team will then onward refer patients to appropriate cancer /specialty teams or discharge patients back to the care of their GP.
